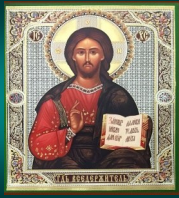

## FROM FATHER PETER

DECEMBER 2025

### A CHRISTMAS REALITY CHECK

Approaching the Feast of the Nativity of Christ, it is an opportunity to pause and contemplate this important event in the history of salvation – the birth of God as man. It is not the only part of God’s plan for us, but one of many, leading us to the Crucifixion and Resurrection.

We would be mistaken if we considered the Nativity as the “beginning” of our salvation. God’s plan for our salvation begins immediately after the disobedience of Adam. As the priest prays to God the Father at the anaphora (the consecration of the Holy Gifts) during the Divine Liturgy: *“You brought us out of nothing into being, and when we had fallen away, You raised us up again. You left nothing undone until you had led us up to heaven and graced us Your Kingdom” (Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom).*

This plan for our salvation runs through the Old Testament, and especially the Prophets, and is communicated to us, and fulfilled and made real in the Holy Gospel. Everything the Church believes and prays finds its basis in the Scriptures (old and new), and the experience of its faithful.

Over time, some have decided to challenge these foundations of faith; sometimes this is due to the need to conform to some literal sense of what the Bible is stating. By doing this, it often changes what is believed and prayed, and unwittingly – as is the case of many theological disputes that have arisen over time – creating heresy, changing the very nature of Christ, the Holy Trinity, and salvation itself given to us.

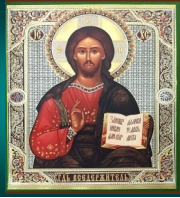
In Scripture, the translation, mistranslation or even omission of words may be considered out of a literal sense, yet this ignores the meaning of these words, which is vitally important

One of the passages of Scripture, from Isaiah, particularly Isaiah 7:14, illustrates this. In the Septuagint (the translation of the Old Testament from Hebrew to Koine Greek made about 300 BC, and is the accepted version of the Law and the Prophets used by the Orthodox and to great extent, Catholic churches), the prophecy of Isaiah 7:14 is:

*“Therefore, the Lord Himself will give you a sign: behold, the virgin (emphasis mine – PB) shall conceive and bear a Son, and you shall call His name Immanuel” (Isaiah 7:14, NKJV)*

Interestingly, in some translations of the Old Testament (particularly those used by Protestant confessions), the word “virgin” is replaced by “the young woman” (some even just “a young woman”). Unlike translations based on the Septuagint, later translations of the Bible are based on the Masoretic (some people call it the “Hebrew”) text. The Masoretes were Jewish scholars located mainly in northern Europe who translated from the late 4<sup>th</sup> century to the 9<sup>th</sup> century AD (at least 500 years after the Septuagint).

Both the Septuagint and Masoretic claim to use some of the same Hebrew manuscripts. The key in both is translation of the Hebrew word “almah”. This word literally means “an unmarried woman”, which according to St. Jerome implies “a hidden virgin, shut off from the occasional sight of men”. The Greek translators of the Septuagint translate this word directly

“parthenos” (παρθένος) – virgin.

If we simply accept the Masoretic translation in the literal sense, it changes the meaning and impact of the prophecy of Isaiah. Why would the Masoretes do this? The Septuagint version is extensively quoted in the Christian scriptures, and by the 4<sup>th</sup> century AD, the Old Testament prophecies according to the Septuagint (and Latin Vulgate bible), and their quotation in the Gospels, were widespread.

Whether by intent or not, the Masoretes, as Jewish scholars, wanted to de-emphasize these prophecies, which were being used by the Christian church, to degrade their meaning. Of course, some accept this as they focus on the literal meaning, due to questionable event (in their mind) of a virgin becoming pregnant. Regardless, by simply adopting “the young woman” (or “a young woman”), without appreciating the true sense of the word, the miracle of the virgin Birth is discounted.

But, as St. Jerome states (explaining his efforts to translate the Scriptures into Latin): “*I render sense for sense, and not word for word” (St. Jerome, Letter 57). Even in the proper translation of the Hebrew word “almah”, the sense is that of a “virgin”, of a woman of special grace chosen by God to be the human instrument through which He would assume our nature and come into the world for our Salvation.*

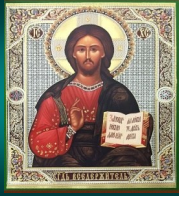
This is not an insignificant issue. By rejecting the prophesy of the virgin Birth, this leads to a denial of the Incarnation (God becoming man), and of everything else in the life of Christ. Jesus becomes, in some people’s minds, a great teacher, a nice guy (certainly not untrue), but not Divine, not the Son of God, not the Messiah. It is all part of God’s plan for our salvation and if we “pick and choose” what we believe to be true or plausible, it degrades the great mystery of God and his actions.

As we prepare to celebrate the Birth of our Lord and Savior, let us embrace the entire mystery of our salvation – the Incarnation, the Virgin Birth, His Baptism and ministry, His trial and Crucifixion, and His glorious Resurrection and Ascension – rooted in the words chanted in the Kontakion of the Nativity

*“Today the Virgin comes to the cave, to give birth to the pre-eternal Word!”*

***CHRIST IS BORN! GLORIFY HIM!***

### **Message from the Parish Council President – December 2025**

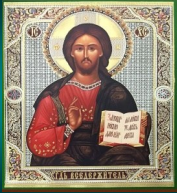
#### **ΧΡΙΣΤΟΣ ΓΕΝΝΑΤΑΙ! CHRIST IS BORN!**

### PROCEDURE FOR RECEIPTS


Due to the rising cost of mailing receipts for every donation received by the church, the Parish Council has established the following procedure for receipts:

When you mail in a donation to the church, or drop it off in the office, a receipt will not be mailed or given to parishioners of Assumption Greek Orthodox Church. Your cancelled check can be used as proof of your payment, as well as the contribution statement you receive from the church at the end of the year. This includes donations for stewardship, iconography, cash raffle, golf outing, memorials, miscellaneous, etc. For credit card charges, please allow 24 hours to process your payment.

If you require a receipt, please contact the church office or see a Parish Council member on Sunday's. Receipts will continue to be mailed to non-parishioners.

## MEMORIAL DONATIONS

“Donations made at an Orthodox Funeral service in memory of the departed are typically collected by the church, which then presents the names and final donation amount to the designated surviving family member. Any memorial donation checks not marked “*Assumption Church*” will be distributed for the purpose indicated on the check.

## ASSUMPTION GOC MEMBER POLICY

The current approved policy for Parishioner Status of the Assumption Greek Orthodox Church (AGOC) of Grand Blanc, Michigan is as follows:

**Parishioner** - Person Baptized and Chrismated according the rites of the Orthodox Church and attending the AGOC.

### **Parishioner - Member in Good Standing:**

- Person in compliance with Section 1 and 2 of Article 18 of the Uniform Parish Regulations of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese.
- Person with an AGOC pledge card on file with a minimum pledge of \$600 per family or \$350 per single and current in pledges for active and preceding year.

**In-Active Parishioner** - Person not in compliance with requirements for Parishioner or Member in Good Standing as defined above.

Parishioners and In-Active Parishioners can receive all sacraments at AGOC but are required to pay church usage fee.

Any deviations from this policy must be approved by the Parish Priest and Parish Council President and must be presented to them at least one month prior to the proposed sacrament date.

**Stewardship Policy** - Only cash, check or credit card can be accepted as payment of stewardship. Donations of items or services cannot be accepted for stewardship in lieu of monetary payment.

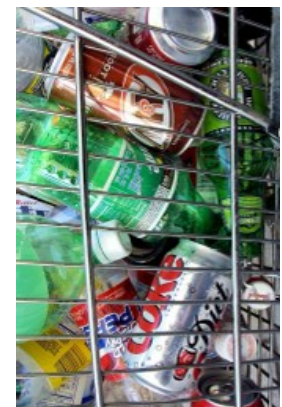

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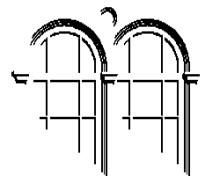
