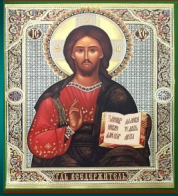

## FROM FATHER PETER

APRIL 2026

BUYING TIME

CHRIST IS RISEN!

After the Resurrection, the Gospel of Matthew describes the encounter between the elders and chief priests and the Roman guard tasked with guarding the tomb:

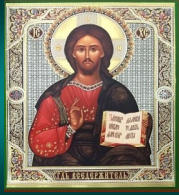
*“When they had assembled with the elders and consulted together, they gave a large sum of money to the soldiers, saying “Tell them, ‘His disciples came at night and stole Him away while we slept” (Matt. 28:12-13)*

Incredibly, this did not simply mean the soldiers fail in their duty, but also that they failed because they were inattentive or even asleep when this took place (a serious dereliction of duty, indeed) and that the chief priests would, as we say, “run interference” for them if the governor, Pontius Pilate, found out. Matthew’s gospel follows up with the fact that this story is perpetuated even to this day.

They had to do this, because the rulers knew that this would mean their power was worth nothing, that one more promise by this man who they considered a troublemaker had come true. During Jesus’ entire ministry on earth, His teaching and His miracles were seen as a threat to their hold on power. The scribes and Pharisees tried various ways to counter His teaching. When Jesus cast out demons, He was accused of doing so through the power of Satan (the “ruler of the demons” – Matt. 9:34). When He challenged the Pharisees openly, in many instances, they questioned His authority or tried to trick Him into giving responses that they could use against Him.

Despite Jesus’ repeated declaration that His Kingdom was “not of this world”, all of Christ’s actions were seen as challenges – direct and indirect – to their hold on power, and not to be ignored.

History shows us repeatedly how many trying to hold on to worldly power and influence do so by attempting to buy time in some way - responding or deflecting, suppressing, and even eliminating those who challenge them. It is worth noting how the same methods have

always been used: ridicule, gaslighting, discrediting, misinformation, intimidation – the list goes on. There are few methods that are truly original, and only occasionally creative in the manner they are exercised. Everything done is designed to buy time, to hold on to power, to avoid punishment or retribution; to deny reality and stave off the inevitable.

Christ's life and teaching is meant to buy us time as well. By teaching us love for God and love for our neighbor, He provides us the means to create the conditions of the Kingdom of Heaven here on earth as far as is possible, to release the hold of this world on us and to provide the opportunity for our repentance and reconciliation.

Christ buys us this time through His example, and through His suffering in crucifixion, and above all His triumph in the Resurrection. Unlike the type of worldly time that many seek for their personal purposes (and ultimately fail at), Christ does not buy us time for us to exercise power and authority over others in this world, but to subject ourselves to His power in this world and the next and enjoy His unconditional love for us.

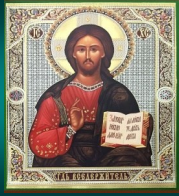
Christ does not buy the kind of time which binds human life and events and is transitory.

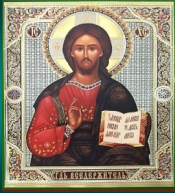

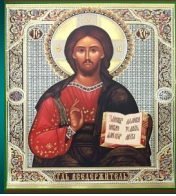

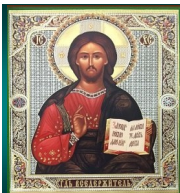

### BOARD

GA President – Dena Altheide Nominated by Lori Photiou motion passed

GA Secretary – Lori Photiou nominated by Diane Foraker motion passed

### REPORTS

1. Opening remarks by Nancy Chinonis – Thanked everyone for their commitment. Reported that the PC has worked very hard this year. Installed a new electronic sign, reinstated RE for youth and continued adult re. PC election coming up in December looking for nominations. It is not just the PC task to run the parish. Audit Committee is also looking for a new member to replace Lucas Photiou.
2. Priest Report was presented by Nancy Chinonis – see attachment
3. Treasurers Report was presented by JoAnne Schultze
  - a. Account Balances as of 9/30– Checking ~\$70,000, Holding account \$103097.10 golf \$48970 cash \$31300 donation 19295, altar items 1799.66, hall rental \$500, RE \$408.36. ICON/Parking Lot/Wall Savings 5016.57, Investment Wall – 279641, Investment Iconography \$217,916.56 held at LPL Financial
  - b. 2026 Proposed budget – we will have to have a special meeting to pass this
    - i. Increased stewardship to \$145,000
    - ii. Miscellaneous was broke down to include what is in it
    - iii. Net income of \$18,867
4. Stewardship Report – If Father would retire, a young married priest with a family would cost our church \$130,000 a year. The budget was adjusted to account for this. We understand that everything is costing more on personal budgets, as well as it does to the church. Nancy is asking for a 10%+ increase for the 2026 stewardship pledge. Coming in the future, there will be discussions about planned giving to the church. This was discussed at the clergy laity.
5. Fund Raising Events
  - a. Fish Fry – Fall is going slower than normal. We have 3 left and still need help. Olga reported that people are saying they don't know we are open. Stella suggested we get a news release to her. She also suggested coming in for the community wide show.
  - b.
  - c. Golf Outing – John K was absent but left an update. Thanks to Diane Foraker for the price we get for the event. Gross \$52,040.60, net income \$24,111.54. All silent auction items were donated except for a couple
  - d. Raffles
    - i. Cash Raffle – 250 tickets @ \$200 prize paid out \$21,800, \$200 expense, Hamo donated back \$2500, 5 winners from church donated back a total of \$1000, profit \$31,500. The cost of doing a

dinner would no longer be feasible. We would have to charge \$350-\$400 to maintain the profit we currently receive. It has been suggested to keep it at the same price but increase the tickets to 270 or 280.

ii. Super Draw - moving date to February or March to spread out the raffles.

6. Philoptochos – see attached report – the food drive is ending on the 15<sup>th</sup> for the FISH project. If anyone wants to give a monetary donation for the school project they can.

New Business – Stella had an idea for stewardship of a stewardship piggy bank for spare change to get a few extra dollars.

Old Business

- Audit Committee – Nancy shared the report from the committee. See attached report. Jeff Lauster was recommended for the open position. Jeff accepted the position.

### REPORTS

- 2026 Proposed budget – presented by JoAnne Schultze
  - John Costa asked for clarification of the differences between the 2025 actual vs. the 2026 budget for Miscellaneous Income/Donations.
    - Miscellaneous was broken down to include what is in it
  - Lori Photiou asked for clarification on the \$10,000 from the memorial account.
    - This is the anticipated amount we will be able to use in 2026.
  - Michael Kus made a motion to approve, Elaine Joynt seconded, motion passed.
- Audit Committee – presented by Michael Kus
  - It was the same committee as last year: Michael Kus, Shannon Kallis, and Lucas Photiou
  - They did the work in June 2025.
  - Reviewed several items across the business. They picked 1<sup>st</sup> month of every quarter. He reported much better records than in the previous 2 years. A recommendation was to implement an accounting system and print the checks off that system. One concern was they found the checkbook out in the open. The treasurer would then just have to review and sign the checks. The records are in very good shape.
  - Father thanked Michael for his work on the audit.
  - Nancy clarified that the process has been changed and we are now using the Sage Accounting software and checks are being printed from that system weekly then reviewed and signed by the treasurer and another signer.
  - Michael shared that we should investigate only emailing newsletters. He also said we should look at possibly changing financial institutions if Choice One does not allow checks to be viewed online.

John Costa made a motion to adjourn at 11:57 AM, Nancy Chinonis seconded and the motion passed.

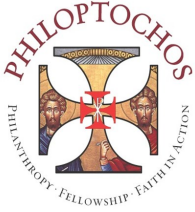

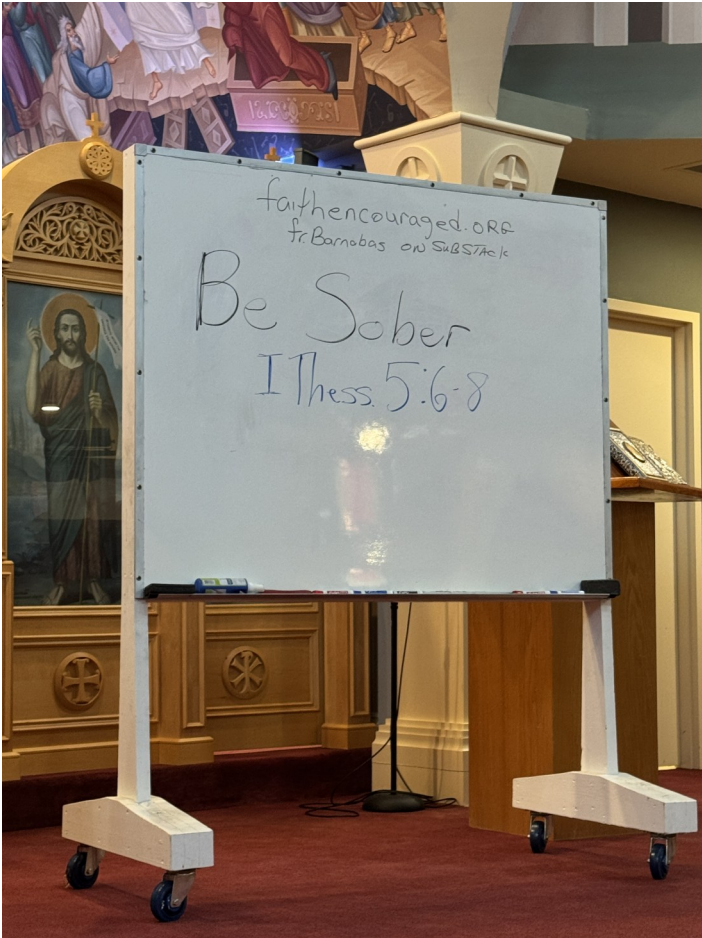

### **PROCEDURE FOR RECEIPTS**


Due to the rising cost of mailing receipts for every donation received by the church, the Parish Council has established the following procedure for receipts:

If you require a receipt, please contact the church office or see a Parish Council member on Sunday's. Receipts will continue to be mailed to non-parishioners.

## MEMORIAL DONATIONS

“Donations made at an Orthodox Funeral service in memory of the departed are typically collected by the church, which then presents the names and final donation amount to the designated surviving family member. Any memorial donation checks not marked “*Assumption Church*” will be distributed for the purpose indicated on the check.

## ASSUMPTION GOC MEMBER POLICY

The current approved policy for Parishioner Status of the Assumption Greek Orthodox Church (AGOC) of Grand Blanc, Michigan is as follows:

**Parishioner** - Person Baptized and Chrismated according the rites of the Orthodox Church and attending the AGOC.

### **Parishioner - Member in Good Standing:**

- Person in compliance with Section 1 and 2 of Article 18 of the Uniform Parish Regulations of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese.
- Person with an AGOC pledge card on file with a minimum pledge of \$600 per family or \$350 per single and current in pledges for active and preceding year.

**In-Active Parishioner** - Person not in compliance with requirements for Parishioner or Member in Good Standing as defined above.

Parishioners and In-Active Parishioners can receive all sacraments at AGOC but are required to pay church usage fee.

Any deviations from this policy must be approved by the Parish Priest and Parish Council President and must be presented to them at least one month prior to the proposed sacrament date.

**Stewardship Policy** - Only cash, check or credit card can be accepted as payment of stewardship. Donations of items or services cannot be accepted for stewardship in lieu of monetary payment.

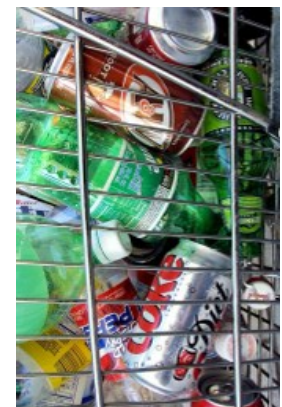

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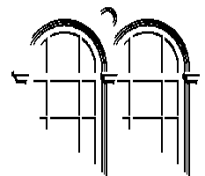
